STATE OF THE CITY

Mayor George Coleman

The City has made great strides over the past year. In spite of a tight budget, the City is sound financially. The most important issue facing our City is the improvement of the infrastructure. The resolution of this issue began with your approval of the 2006 Bond referendum, which enables the City to finance stormwater improvements. You have probably seen flags placed along the rights-of-way; the flags indicate the route of the piping, which will convey stormwater to holding facilities. Most excess water east of Highway 17/92 will flow south along I-4, or be piped to another outlet near 17/92, eventually exiting south of DeBary. Runoff west of Highway 17/92 will go to the borrow pit which is located in the southwest portion of our City near Lake Konomac. Several properties have been purchased, which will serve as stormwater retention/detention ponds. FEMA has pledged, by a grant agreement, \$375,000 to the City for the design and permitting of the Westside Emergency Flood Management System; FDOT has committed to \$1 million in participation; and the Florida Legislature has committed to an appropriation of \$.5 million.

The City Council enacted the following in 2006: Implemented a Pass-Through Fees Ordinance for developers to pay for costs to the City that are in excess of the usual flat fee paid by the applicant; Approved Impact Fees for Government Buildings and Parks & Recreation Facilities so that new growth pays for itself; Implemented an adjusted Growth Management Fee Schedule so that services are paid for by users and not by the City's General Fund; Approved Revised Conceptual Plan for Gateway Center for the Arts at Gateway Park; Amended Animal Control regulations regarding dangerous dogs; Approved changes to the Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan; Approved amendments to the City's Comprehensive Plan; and Approved the Nuisance Tree Ordinance.

We will continue to focus on creating a safe environment in our City. A State of Florida Department of Community Affairs \$4,000 CERT grant has been received. The Neighborhood Improvement Officer is making great inroads on resolving safety as well as aesthetic problems, which will also help protect property values. First-class City services are important to the City's future. We strive for a balance to provide more efficient City services for less money.

The City has received a donation of two lots on Naranja Road from the County of Volusia, which will be used for the construction of a new City Hall. All City staff will be at this one location, where, in safe and efficient working conditions, they will continue to serve our citizens.

I want to pay tribute to the dedicated residents who serve on the City's boards and committees and provide advice on new programs and help to solve existing problems. In addition, many residents have attended the CERT and Neighborhood Watch programs; this training provides a safety element for the entire City.

Our Council is dedicated to making decisions that are fair and reasonable; to make our City as safe as possible; to be fiscally responsible; and to make our City one where good jobs will be plentiful. With your support, our City will go forward to an even better future.

PROTECT YOUR PETS

There have been many reports of dogs running loose in the City and being hit by cars, found to be in a dehydrated condition, or have been hurt. Also, if the pet is aggressive with strangers, then residents may be at risk.

If your pet is lost, call Animal Control (740-5241) and City Hall (668-2040). Also, report if you find a dog/cat who appears lost or hurt. If an animal is picked up by Animal Control and does not have an implanted Chip and the owner is not found before the end of the day, Animal Control will take the pet to Halifax. For lost pets, you should personally visit the Halifax Humane Society at 2364 LPGA Blvd. at I-95 – Mondays thru Saturdays 10 AM-6 PM and on Sundays 10 AM-2 PM. (386/274-4703 Ext. 0)

Halifax will hold the pet for 72 hours and then it will be evaluated for adoption. How long the pet will stay in adoption depends on how much space is available. Halifax takes in approximately 15,000 animals each year, so euthanasia occurs frequently.

An implanted Chip is smart protection for your pet. Chips are inert, have no power supply, and last over 25 years. Chips contain the pet's information, and, once the Chip is read, you would be contacted immediately. With the collar type, anyone who finds the pet can call the toll-free number for the contact information. An owner can also notify the toll-free number (the recovery service) if a pet is lost or stolen. Plan ahead to head off pet problems!

TREE PROTECTION

DeBary Ordinance #08-07 for Tree Protection, which was approved by City Council on March 7, 2007, states: At permit submittal for single family residences, a tree survey will be required that identifies the footprint of the house and driveway, location of the well and septic, and all trees over 6" diameter. The County Forester determines which trees will be removed. The replacement requirement would be 5%. The applicant can request additional tree removal, with a replacement requirement of 15%. If, at final inspection, it is found that non-approved trees were removed, replacement will be at 100%.

On an owner-occupied lot, any pine tree can be removed – no permit required. Call the County Forester at 386/736-5927 regarding questions concerning Historic trees which are live oaks over 30" diameter, magnolias over 24" diameter, and cypress 36" diameter and over.

Thanks to all those who suggested names for the City's nature park. The name selected for the City's newest park is *River City Nature Park*.



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
